Our next board meeting is scheduled for Saturday, January 11th beginning at 9 am at the Dolds house at 3401 Wolf Creek Ranch Road. Owners are always invited and encouraged to attend Owner Association meetings. Meeting notices are posted outside of Nelda's office and at the mailbox kiosk. Nelda will forward this agenda inviting all owners to attend. As usual, try to arrive by 8:45 so we can get started promptly at 9 am.

Our primary topics of discussion will be (1) adoption of a process for nominating and electing two director positions whose terms expire in April and (2) end-of-year financial summary on how actual spending for the year lined up with the 2013 Budget plan.

Fred Ball and Lee Kinard have served two terms as Association directors beginning in 2009 and each will need to decide whether to place their names on the ballot for a successive three year term. Moore and Dold each have two years remaining on their term of office; Snyder, Hill and Ring will be serving the final year of their three year term and will have to decide this time next year whether to run for another term. All directors elected in 2010 and after serve three year terms.

I will mail each of the directors copies of a draft nomination form and ballot later this week for board consideration and action. It will be substantially similar to last year's form, amended only for this year's election.

Order of business follows:

Lee Kinard Review any changes made to your draft of the November minutes and move to accept the minutes as amended. Next, stand for your well deserved applause and take a bow for having gotten the guideway for the dock extended, mooring cables set and all completed, as planned, before year's end. The dock now is floating - - albeit barely - - with the dock ramp fully extended along the new 45' long guideway section. Formerly, the dock would be substantially grounded when the elevation of Lake Buchanan got down to about 994 - 995'. With the extension, it appears the dock will be floating at lake levels above about 986 - 987'.

Mike Moore ... you too will have to surrender to public accolade for managing placement of the third firewater storage tank in Wolf Creek and substantially completing the long awaited upgrade of the Middle Gate. These two additions notably improve security within our community from wild land fire hazards and

unautnorizea entry.

Bill Bishop/McKanna/Carlberg Please brief the board on Design Review Board activities since our last meeting and the status of proposed construction activity pending before the DRB.

Denny Hill ... Your report is always a highlight of interest to the board. Bring us current on year-end operating and capital improvement financials. We should also discuss when to commission this year's perimeter fence replacement section.

Bob Snyder ... There is always owner interest this time of year in the Managed Land Deer Program harvesting count to date. Please include observations you and any Texas Parks and Wildlife personnel may have made to you about this year's harvest.

Warren Dold ... (1) I'll have an update on Bud Green's most recent medical crisis; (2) we have not had a broad discussion about community security issues effecting the ranch in some time. To the best of my knowledge, we have had only two incidents of theft/vandalism in Wolf Creek in the last eight years. However, given the importance the Association places on security, it seems a good time now to have a discussion about potential opportunities we may have to further safeguard ourselves; (3) status of road shoulder damage repairs following the October rains and plans to tar/chip the area by the barn adjacent to the dumpsters; (4) Burnet's annual Bluebonnet Festival is scheduled for April 11 - 13, 2014 and, as is the custom, our Wolf Creek Ranch Owners ROUNDUP event is calendared that same weekend on Saturday, April 12th at the Pavillion. We'll discuss reactivating the Roundup Planning Committee who do such a great job each year with table decorations and event theme. Set April 12th from 4 - 7 pm in concrete on your calenders for our annual Roundup event; (5) update the group on activities of our rattlesnake harvesters; (6) briefly discuss and distribute Central Texas Water Coalition's annual report to contributors; and (7) set a date for our next Association meeting.... check calendars for April 26th or May 3rd.

I took a picture of the good snake but on the rocks it was hard to tell how long he was in the picture...probably 6'...didn't have my measuring tape w/me!

I have concerns about them taking non-poisonous snakes for the good they do w/rats and other critters. So what is the definition of "mostly" as it applies to what they will take? For some reason, people think all snakes are bad and evil. No, I'm not a "snake worshipper" but not all snakes are bad! Rather have a good snake anyday than creepy spiders!!! CTWC 2013 Year End Update

Dear Friends,

CTWC has had another very busy and productive year, and we certainly have a lot to celebrate. We are proud of the work we have done to protect the water in the upper Colorado River basin, but it is an ongoing struggle, as you know.

Lake Travis and Buchanan have not recovered from the loss of the 433,000 AF of water sent downstream in 2011, but we do have LCRA Board members who are working to make decisions based upon science and not politics as usual. While we have seen more rain in the area this year, it has NOT rained over the watersheds that feed our lakes.

Our goal to educate the 1.5 million residents of Central Texas about water is moving forward slowly but effectively, particularly as this Mega-Drought continues and appears to be with us for as much as ten more years! We must ALL start addressing our water usage and seriously conserve!

We know we would not have had our victories in 2013 without your help. As this year-end approaches, we hope you will consider a contribution to help fund our work. CTWC's Recap of 2013:

A review of 2013 HAS to start with the Fredericksburg November 2012 LCRA meeting which hundreds of you attended. We all worked to have the LCRA pass an Emergency Drought Order (EDO) that would protect our drinking water. Instead, they voted on an EDO with a 775,000 AF cutoff, only to revisit it in January 2013 and vote for the 850,000 AF cutoff. Senator Kirk Watson and Senator Trov Fraser were instrumental in having the board reconsider and use a less risky

cutoff. They stated that Central Texas, not rice farms, must be LCRA's chief priority during a drought.

As Texas baked in the ongoing drought, water became the big issue for legislators, and CTWC worked with numerous legislators on water bills. CTWC spent many many days at the Capital during this past legislative session. Rep. Ritter proposed bills that would draw \$2 billion from the State's emergency Rainy Day Fund to establish a water infrastructure bank that would lend money for the State Water Plan (SWP) projects. This was also known as Proposition 6. Sen. Fraser proposed bills to reorganize the Texas Water Development Board, which resulted in three full-time commissioners rather than a part-time board of six, a prioritizing of the SWP projects, and a focus on the need for serious conservation.

In February, thinking outside the box and trying to find a way to help the entire basin, CTWC called on the LCRA to evaluate and implement other opportunities to solve the current and future water supply shortage that exists in the lower Colorado River basin. Specifically, we suggested the LCRA's voluntary acquisition of water-intensive irrigation lands as an affordable, sensible, water-saving action to meet the needs of its firm customers and free up billions of gallons of water a year without lower Colorado River system. LCRA did not choose to consider this option.

The remainder of the legislative session saw Rep. Donna Howard proposing a bill for a sunset review of LCRA (failed), Sen. Birdwell and Rep. Keffer's bill calling for a performance review of LCRA and the BRA (passes), and numerous bills addressing use of new water technology. CTWC was asked to testify at many hearings, and we did recognize that there must be legislation changes in order to protect our drinking water.

Meanwhile, back at LCRA, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), which has to approve the proposed Water Management Plan (WMP) submitted by LCRA, decided NOT to approve the WMP. Instead, driven by public concern and comments they are reviewing new hydrological data on the LCRA plan. The new analysis will take at least 10 months. CTWC and our hydrologist, Dr. Jordan Furnans, Intera, also provided new hydrological data to TCEQ. In the meantime, the EDO will keep water in the lakes.

During the summer. There were many concerns around health and safety issues as firefighters fought low water pressure due to low lake levels. The continuing drought impacted home values, school taxes, and continued to severely impact the businesses around the lakes as well as the tourism industry for the third year. Spirits dropped along with the lake levels, as residents began to realize that their drinking water was at risk. Carlos 'N Charlie's, an iconic restaurant on Lake Travis, was only one of the economic victims in Central Texas. Searching for more water, LCRA even considered lowering the level of Lake Austin and other pass-through lakes.

On October 3rd CTWC attended the Austin City Council meeting where Austin Water Utility Director Greg Meszaros laid out one forecast with the assumption of continued record-low inflows into the lakes as in 2011. If they do, the lakes go dry in two to three years.

Fall brought no relief from the drought, but it did bring a change in attitude from LCRA as they accepted the fact that drinking water for Central Texas is at risk. A change in the thinking and the new look at water policies in hydrology led LCRA to propose another EDO with a 1.1 million AF cutoff. This passed by an 8 to 7 board vote, and may lead to a new battle at TCEQ as the rice farmers fight to continue using stored water for their rice crops. CTWC and other firm customers will be supporting the 1.1 million AF cutoff, though we think that is still to risky and asked for the trigger to be set at 1.4 million AF. Tentative meeting schedule at the TCEQ on January 15th.

In 2013, CTWC was part of 2 documentaries. One on the US drought, which was submitted for SXSW and the 2nd one produced by CNN's Weather Channel titled "Water Wars". We are participating as stakeholders with various regional and state communities such as Andy Samson's Grand Water Challenge Group and another environmental group, The Lakes, Rivers and Bays group. We participated on a Water discussion panel on KXAN and YNN TV. We continue to monitor all LCRA meetings as this current drought breaks records as the worst in Texas history. Look for current information on our website and Facebook.

On December 31, Becky Motal will step down as LCRA General Manager, and Ross Phillips, a current LCRA employee, will serve as interim general manager until the LCRA Board selects the next leader from nation-wide applicants.

CTWC will continue to work to have our water needs recognized by the TWDB and Region K, our

providing scientific data and common sense to the regional committee.

In 2014, we will be hosting Water Town Hall meetings around Central Texas to share our latest data and get your input. Spicewood Vineyard was the host of our latest meeting, and we continue to be thankful for the support from all of you, and businesses such as Sail and Ski for hosting fundraisers.

BIG NEWS: Omni Resorts is graciously hosting our 1st Annual Golf Tournament Fundraiser to be held May 12, 2014. Watch for more information.

We are thankful for all of the support from YOU as well as our many other partners, businesses, municipalities, water supply companies, and especially Burnet County Judge Donna Klaeger who has helped in a myriad of ways, and our Central Texas elected officials, from mayors to city managers; from commissioners to judges; from representatives and senators.

To continue our work we need your support and your contributions. Thank you again for all you do, and we wish a happy and Safe Holiday to you all!

The following requests and actions of Design Review Board took place since the WCROA Board meeting of November 9, 2013:

1. November 10, 2013. Request of Dennis and Sue Hill for a permanent address marker.

DRB Action: The DRB granted approval on November 10, 2013.

2. November 16, 2013. Request of Mike and Joni Moore to extend their stained concrete drive from the cattle guard at their gate to the street.

DRB Action: The DRB granted approval on November 16, 2013.

3. November 27, 2013. Revised application for approval to build a single family dwelling on WB-5B1. A variance has been requested by the Gene and Dorine Petru to place their home at a location that would encroach the 100' setback to the common boundary line with Dennis and Sue Hill on WB-5A. It is the DRB's understanding that the variance request has been proposed to the Hills. The DRB has requested a site plan indicating all distances between the proposed structure and the setback.


